A major accomplishment was the removal of the \$66,000 indebtedness on the College, February 1, 1945.

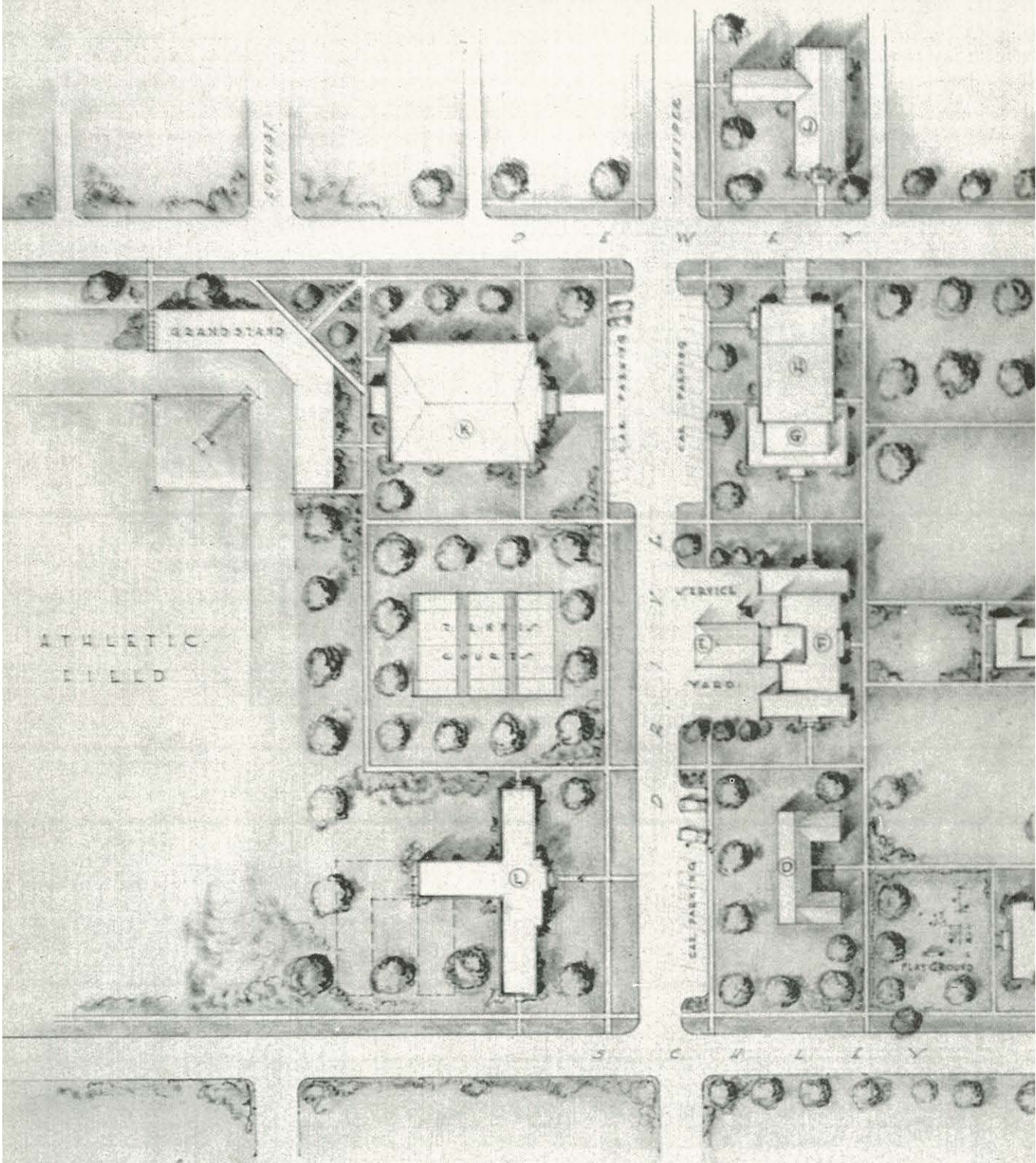
