Argentina

The work of the Church of the Nazarene began officially in 1919. Located on the Cono-Sur (Southern Cone) Field of the South America Region, Argentina is often referred to as a “crucible of races.” The background of the vast majority of Argentina’s population is European (mainly of Spanish and Italian descent) and the “mestizo” (a mixture of European and Amerindian ancestry). While nine of ten people in Argentina say they are Christians, most admit that they do not practice their faith beyond occasional celebrations of Christian holidays. These factors make the work of the Church of the Nazarene both challenging and critical for this generation. In the story below, we celebrate, with the churches in Argentina, the ordination of ministers who enter the “crucible” to bring faith, healing, and hope to Argentina. The South America regional office is located in the capital city of Buenos Aires. There are currently 10 missionaries serving in Argentina.

NMI SNAPSHOT



It takes time to prepare for ministry. Recently, 10 new elders were ordained for the work of the Church of the Nazarene in Argentina. Ordination services were conducted on the Northwest and North Patagonia districts during the first quarter of 2023.

In Argentina, the Church of the Nazarene has a broad and strong presence. The districts that carried out the ordinations are examples of how important it is to form, train, and send pastors out to continue the work of the Lord.



The ordination services brought great joy to the ordinands and to regional and district leaders in attendance, as well as the churches these elders represent. When a minister completes his or her studies and practical ministry requirements, he or she is eligible to be ordained as an elder in the Church of the Nazarene. Ordination is a ceremony that includes all of the elders who are present and is led by a general superintendent. As part of this ceremony, the elders will gather around the individual who is being ordained and will pray that the Lord will bless their ministry. They place their hand on the shoulder of the person being ordained and if they cannot reach that person, they will place their hand on the shoulder of the person in front of them. This is called “laying on of hands by the clergy.” As an ordained elder, ministers have full rights and privileges to carry out their call from God to preach and lead with the gifts that God has given them.

Every generation needs ministers who will dedicate their lives to carrying out the work of the Church as pastors, leaders, teachers, and missionaries so that the transformative message of the Gospel may reach people around the world. Because of this dedication, the Church of the Nazarene has grown across Argentina, and its influence is growing beyond its borders.



Dr. Fili Chambo, general superintendent in jurisdiction, said, "One of the reasons for the growth of the Lord's work is the obedience of his servants to fulfill the great commission." The churches in Argentina celebrate this special moment in the development of the work of the Church of the Nazarene.
