Located on the Melanesian South Field of the Asia-Pacific Region, the island nation of Papua New Guinea (PNG) has 22 provinces, some of which are so remote that they are only accessible by air. Before gaining its independence from Australia in 1975, PNG had known a long history of complex foreign rule; a divided nation under German, British, and Australian governance. PNG is noted to be one of the world's most linguistically diverse nations, boasting 839 languages. The work of the Church of the Nazarene officially started in 1955. Ten of the 17 districts are accessible by road, and seven districts by air. Present in all 22 provinces, the Church of the Nazarene is noted for its superb work through the Kudjip Nazarene Hospital, and the Nazarene College of Nursing. In a country where the majority of the population has limited educational background, with an estimated half of the population under the age of 25 years, the Church of the Nazarene is committed to an educational enterprise that can change communities with the Good News of Jesus, and the professional development of those who would serve those communities.
